Constitutional Amendment Question #1 (vote yes or no)

Shall the following be adopted?

4. Individual right to bear arms; armies. ~~The people have the right to bear arms for their defense and security~~ A person has the right to keep and bear arms for the defense of self, family, home and state, for lawful hunting and recreational use, and for any other lawful purpose; but standing armies, in time of peace, are dangerous to liberty, and shall not be tolerated, and the military shall be strict in subordination to the civil power.

Shall the following be adopted?

2. Disqualification to vote. The legislature may, by law, exclude persons from voting because of ~~mental illness~~ or commitment to a jail or penal institution. No person convicted of a felony under the laws of any state or of the United States, unless pardoned or restored to his civil rights, shall be qualified to vote.
